Job Description

INFANT- EARLY CHILDHOOD MENTAL HEALTH THERAPIST

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The Infant-Early Childhood Mental Health (IECMH) Therapist provides infant-early childhood and perinatal mental health services to North King County and South Snohomish County families. Reports to the IECMH Manager.

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES – Specific for this position

- Provide infant-early childhood mental health services to families with children ages birth to six and pregnant women, using relationship-based approaches
- Provide assessments/intakes, individual counseling, family counseling, case management, and related services to families in the IEC Mental Health Program
- Regularly screen clients for health care issues and refer to appropriate services
- Participate in program development and evaluation of the IEC Program and overall Mental Health Department
- Actively promote CHS programs to families and individuals; develop and maintain relationships with community contacts, referral sources, and other professionals and agencies



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- Maintain accurate and thorough clinical records as per agency, county and state requirements
- Provide input and report to leadership regarding the clinical needs of clients and improved ways of offering services and supervision.
- Sustain billable hours as determined by supervisor
- Collaborates closely with the IECMH team
- Participate in regular reflective supervision, case consultation, and all-staff meetings
- Work towards Washington State IMH/IEC Endorsement
- Meet with clients in homes and the community as well as the office
- Maintain a client caseload and appropriate clinical records
- Conduct collaborative documentation with clients during therapy sessions
- Maintain a professional and courteous attitude to all clients, partners and community members

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES – Agency in general

- Provide all services utilizing a strengths-based, family-focused, client-centered, trauma-informed, culturally competent approach that is integrated with other services
- Participate in creating and maintaining a workplace that values diversity and treats everyone with dignity and respect without regard to race, color, age, religion, creed, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, national origin, marital status, the presence of any sensory, mental, or physical disability
- Utilize teamwork and open communication

- At least 1 year of experience working with IECMH (Infant-Early Childhood Mental Health)
- Familiar with the DC:0-3R or DC:0-5 manuals
- Ability to assess within the IECMH framework
- Experience providing PFR (Promoting First Relationships) or other IECMH models preferred
- Knowledge of community social services resources and how to access the resources
- Collaborative skills
- Reliable private transportation; valid Washington State Driver's License
- Experience with diverse client groups and treatment methodologies
- Experience working with trauma issues
- Experience providing crisis intervention
- Experience navigating different systems (i.e., families, DSHS)
