YOUTH COMMUNITY MENTOR

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The Youth Community Mentor provides social-emotional mentoring and academic tutoring to youth in our afterschool programs at Ballinger Homes, a King County Housing Authority Complex in Shoreline, WA. The position engages youth in learning experiences that focus on developing math skills and promotes the strengthening of social emotional and other youth developmental assets. Reports to the Out of School Time Program Coordinator. Nonexempt position located at Ballinger Homes Community Room 2200 NE 201st PL. NE, Shoreline, WA 98155.

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES – Position Specific

- Engage youth in tutoring and/or academic activities to promote skill building in math
- Provide developmentally appropriate support for students K-12th grade that include creative hands-on activities that promote learning
- Have a high level of confidence in breaking down complex concepts into easy-to-understand steps
- Have enthusiasm for and promote a positive attitude around education and academics



- Actively participate in the facilitation of programming to achieve the overall program outcomes. This could include, but is not limited to: program planning, set up/clean up, meal preparation support, engaging students in outdoor and enrichment activities.
- Establish trusting relationships with the youth in the program
